#### Welcome each kid by name.

#### Ask:

- Raise your hand if you like funny characters in movies.
- Raise your hand if you like brave characters in movies.



#### Give each kid a Bible.

#### Say:

Let's use our eyes to look at each picture and follow along with our story today!

#### Read:

• The Good Samaritan: Page 379

#### **Review:**

- Turn to page 381.
- Who got hurt in our story today?



**Pray:** Dear God, thank you for sending Jesus to show us how to love others. Help us share with the people around us how much you love them. Amen.



Take out the Parachute and lay it on the ground in the center of your Group. Have your Group circle up and grab a side of the Parachute.

- Place the Red Heart Squishies in the center of the Parachute.
- Say: Jesus loves us so much! When one of the Hearts falls out of our parachute, we will shout, "I can do what Jesus says!"
- Then, place the Heart back in the Parachute and continue playing.

#### Welcome each kid by name.

#### Ask:

- Raise your hand if you like to dress up and wear a cape.
- Raise your hand if you like to dress up and wear a crown.



#### Give each kid a Bible.

#### Say:

Let's use our eyes to look at each picture and follow along with our story today!

#### Read:

• The Good Samaritan: Page 379

#### **Review:**

- Turn to page 381.
- Who got hurt in our story today?
- How many people walked by and didn't help him?



**Pray:** Dear God, thank you for sending Jesus to show us how to love others. Help us share with the people around us how much you love them. Amen.



Take out the roll of Toilet Paper.

- **Say:** We are going to pretend I am the hurt person like in today's story. Will you all help me feel better?
- Give each person in your Group a long piece of Toilet Paper.
- Mention one body part for them to wrap up with their paper.
  - o Options: Bottom of leg and foot, arms, or head
- Give them another long piece of paper for each body part.
- After they wrap each body part, prompt the group to say, "I can do what Jesus says!"

The Good Samaritan Coloring Page with Band-Aid



Some kids may not enjoy coloring as much as others. To keep kids engaged and in Small Group, ask them to color in different ways. You can say, "Can you color his hair brown or yellow?" or "Can we make his shirt 3 different colors?" This gives kids a job to do and keeps them in their Small Group.

#### Ask:

#### Give each kid a Bible.

#### Say:

Let's use our eyes to look at each picture and follow along with our story today!

#### Read:

• The Good Samaritan: Page 379

#### **Review:**

- Turn to page 381.
- Who got hurt in our story today?
- How many people walked by and didn't help him?
- Turn to page 382. Did the man who helped and the hurt man know each other?
- Turn to page 384. What did Jesus tell us to do?



**Pray:** Dear God, thank you for sending Jesus to show us how to love others. Help us share with the people around us how much you love them. Amen.



#### Take out Bendable Jesus.

- **Say:** I am going to hand Jesus to the person beside me. As soon as I hand him off, I am going to start running around the circle and try to make it back to my spot before you all pass Jesus around the Group and he gets back to where I was sitting.
- Hand Jesus off to the person sitting beside you, get up, and start running slowly
  while your Group passes Jesus. Let them make it to your spot before you, just to
  make sure they all understand how to play the game. When Bendable Jesus
  arrives back at the original spot, prompt the kids to say the Bottom Line.
- Allow the next kid to hand off Jesus and race around the circle.
- Keep going around the circle, allowing everyone to have a turn.
